CAP. VII.

A Declaratory Act respecting Actions for Criminal Conversation.

(29th MAY, 1800:)

Preamble.

A criminal verdict not necessary to obtain compen fation in damages for Adultery.

TATHEREAS Doubts have been entertained, whether by the Laws which prevail in this Province, an Action can be maintained for a pecuniary compensation in damages for criminal convertation with the Plaintiff's wife, unless a criminal Process that have been inflitted and a vertical convicting the Party of Adultery, shall have been obtained, which is manifestly inconvenient, For removing such doubts, Be it enacted and declared by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the " fourteenth year of His Majesti's Reign, intituled, " An Act for making more effectual provi-" from for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further " provision for the Government of the land Province," and it is hereby enacted and declared by the authority of the fame, that from and after the passing of this Act, it shall be no valid Exception or Plea in Bar, to an Action for a pecuniary compensation in damages for Criminal Conversation, that the Plaintiff hath not instituted a Criminal Process and obtained a verdict, convicting the Defendant of Adultery, any Law, Cultom or Ulage. to the contrary notwithstanding.

CAP. VIII.

An Act to prevent harbouring run-away Seamen, to repeal certain parts of an Act or Ordinance therein mentioned, and for other purposes.

(29th MAY, 1800.)

Presmble:

Penalty on perfons harbouring electers.

[THEREAS it is essential for the protection of Commerce to prevent harbouring run away Seamen; and whereas the Laws now in force relating thereto are found inadequate to the purpoles intended; Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majelly, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Lower Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain passed in the thirty first year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Ad to repeal certain parts of an 66 Ad passed in the sourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 66 An Att for making " more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and " to make further provision for the Government of the faid Frovince," and it is hereby enacted. by the authority of the lame, that from and after the passing of this Act, if any person. shall lodge, harbour or secret any seaman or apprentice, who shall have described from. any ship or vessel in the service of His Majesty, or who, having regularly entered and. figned Articles of Agreement, to ferve on board any Merchant thip or veffel, thalf. have deferted from the fame, for the space of more than twelve hours, every person so offending, and knowing such feaman or apprentice to be a deferter, shall for the first: offence forfeit the fum of Five Pounds Current money of this Province over and above the penalty inflicted by the tenth Clause of the Act, intituled, " An Act to provide for " the greater security of this Province by the better regulation of the Militia thereof, and for re-
