RELIEF FOR INDIA. Lord Aberdeen Calls on Canadians to Help

TO COMPENSATE CANADIANS. London, Jan. 20.—The Chronicle has reason to believe that the United States Behring Sea commission report will urge the prohibition of pelagic sealing, and advises the United States to compensate Canadians for their loss in the industry.
