Ottawa, May 20.—It is definitely settled that a division on Sir Richard Cartwright's amendment cannot take place this week. About 20 members have yet to speak.

Halifax, N. S., May 20.—Frost yesterday destroyed the Intercolonial Railway terminal wharf, loss \$30,000. There are indications of impending snow.
