Says Rioters are Repentant

doubt if people living at some distance from the scene can fully realize what the flight of the non-union men with their wives and families to the hills really meant. I can see no immediate prospect of work at Extension, because the mines have been considerably damaged.

"Happily at Cumberland the efforts of the strikers to effect a coup failed, and today the mine there is producing more than ever. That was due entirely to the arrival of the militia. Otherwise we might have been faced today with a closure upon all the mines of the Island. The Cumberland production for the last month was a record one, and in face of the general scarcity of production and the consequent rise in price during the winter. I think it is a most excellent thing.

"Among the strikers I suspect that there is a feeling abroad that they are in wrong. Many of those who have been arrested for assault and other offences are now chewing the cud of repentance, and I fancy that before the law is done with them they will be even more melancholy as to their plight. The strike pay of \$1 a week is not to be compared with the regular earnings of the miner, even when they get it for nothing. Of course in one or two instances the strike pay is panning out all right, the additional allowance for wife and children bringing the total up to a respectable figure for larger families. Taken all over, however, there is a feeling of discontent at the condition of things. The men realize that the strike has produced nothing but trouble for themselves, and it takes more than the paltry sum of \$4 a week to compensate them for what may prove the permanent loss of employment."

IN TRAINING FOR THE BIG FIGHT

Vancouver, Sept. 5.—Willie Ritchie returned from the mountains today and started his actual training for his world's championship battle scheduled for this city on the afternoon of Saturday, Sept. 20, against Freddie Welsh.

Welsh greeted Ritchie on the street and was later in the evening dined by a party of famous Welshmen who in the afternoon the visitors were Welsh's guests at his training quarters, watching his afternoon's work, watching the British champion in his workouts.

Sir Marchant Williams, regarded as the greatest Welshman living; Sir John Curtis, the biggest brick manufacturer in England; William Davis, editor of the "Weekly Mail" the oldest paper in Wales, and several other noted Welshmen were in the party. They made a tour of the city in the early afternoon, ending by visiting Welsh in his training quarters, and then taking Freddie to dinner at the Vancouver Hotel.

Ritchie has spent two days in the mountains, and upon arrival in the city, quickly got into his heavy clothes, and ran the seven miles from Vancouver to Burnaby, his training quarters. From now until the day before the big battle the champion will train daily, and keep his five sparring partners and trainer busy. Ritchie looks already in perfect shape, being brown and strong, and carrying himself with a perfect air of confidence.

"I will take things easy for the first few days until I get back in the swing of training," says Ritchie. "Then it will be the hardest kind of work until the day of the battle. I am going to work along the lines of having every ounce possible available without losing my weight forfeit, and I will enter the ring at 135 pounds exact."

TEACHER MURDERED THIRTEEN PEOPLE

Muehlhausen, Baden, Germany, Sept. 5.—A crazed teacher named Wagner, who murdered his wife and four children at Degerloch yesterday set fire to the village of Muehlhausen in four places last night and in a fusillade with the villagers who tried to capture him eight persons were killed and ten wounded.

The man took refuge in a stable, where he killed all the cattle. He was finally overpowered after he had exhausted the 250 cartridges with which he had provided himself. The enraged villagers wreaked their vengeance on him by clubbing him and stabbing him with pitchforks. He will probably die.

When he entered Muehlhausen, it was not known that he was a fugitive murderer. It was only after the wild scenes enacted here that the police went to his apartment in Degerloch, where he had been teaching, and found the bodies of his wife and children.

MINER CRUSHED TO DEATH

Sydney, N. S., Sept. 5.—David Ratchford, of Low Point, was instantly killed and six others were seriously injured by a fall of rock at Dominion No. 1 Colliery this morning. During last night a fall of rock occurred in one of the leads and this morning the underground manager, Hector Campbell, with six men, went into the mine to clear away the debris. Within a few moments of the time the men started to work a second fall occurred causing Ratchford's death.
