

TEACHER MURDERED THIRTEEN PEOPLE Muchlhausen, Baden, Germanv, Sept. 5.-A cra-ed teacher named Wagner, who murdered his wife and

four children at Degerloch y sterday set fire to the village of Muchlhausen ir four places last night and in a fusilade with the villagers who trind to capture him eight persons were killed and ten wounded.

The man took refuge in a stable, where he killed all the cattle. He was finally overpowered after he had exhausted the 250 cartridges with which he had provided himself. The enrated villagers wreaked their vengeance on him by clubbing him and stabbing him with pitchforks. He will probably die. When he entered Muchlhausen, it

was not lnown that he was a fugitive murderer. It was only after the wild scenes enacted here that the rolice went to his apartment in Degerloch, where he had been teaching. and found the bodies of his wife and


