The Daily and Weekly Papers and How They are Distributed.

STRANGE PRESS NOMENCLATURE.

IN the world there are 1,900 daily newspapers published, or fewer than 1,750, or more than a third, are issued in the United States.

Canada has 94 dailies, 670 weeklies and 132 monthlies. Latin America, including under this convenient term Mexico and Central and South America, whose Spanish and Portuguese are spoken, has some 4,500 newspapers of all sorts, 200 of which are printed in other languages than Spanish or Portuguese, almost every foreign tongue being represented.

PERIA HAS six newspapers, all in the native language except one in Syrian. Persian newspapers are more widely circulated and read, in proportion to the number of copies printed, than in any other part of the world.

THE SMALLEST PAPER.

Borneo has the smallest regularly published newspaper in the world—the 'Sarawak Gazette,' printed in English, and first issued in 1867.
