On the lat of September a fleet of 93 American and 79 British mackerel fishing vessels anchored in Souris Roads, and on the 15th we were visited by a fleet of 219 fishermen. They report, that there are at present about 400 sail, (British and American.) fishing mackerel on the coasts of this Island, the Magdalens, Mouth of Bay Chaleur, and Cape Breton, North shore.

I regret to add, that some of the disordely of both nations made a considerable riot here, maltreated some of the Inhabitants, and destroyed some property. It is a pity one of Her Majesty's ships could not be spared to cruizo specially on the above Coasts during the mouths of August and September, as it effectually prevents any riots by the fishermen.
