Marvellous Enthusiasm for Monroe

THE NORTH HAS SLIPPED FROM COAKER'S GRASP—THE SOUTH WEST COAST HAS GONE CLEAN FROM HICKMAN AND CONCEPTION BAY WILL BE A WHIRLWIND AGAINST THEM ALSO—THEIR GAME IS LOST AND RIGHT WELL THEY KNOW IT.

The enthusiasm that Monroe has aroused is so extensive and pronounced that the Coaker-Hickman bootlers and supporters are frantic with despair. They are so shaken to pieces as to be utterly demoralized. They are beaten everywhere and they know it right and well, even to the extent of throwing up their hands and acknowledging that the tide is too strong against them, and that it is impossible for Hickman to win the Government.

The North is sending in the most gratifying assurances of a magnificent victory for the Monroe trio in Bonavista Bay, that Trinity Bay is turning around rapidly in favor of the Monroe trio also, and that even in Twillingate, Fogo and St. Barbe there is a wonderful change in favor of the Monroe candidates.

As to the South West Coast not a man in St. John's to-day will concede that Hickman can get a seat in that section of the country and it is useless to expect it. Within the last twenty-four hours a regular whirlwind of popular sentiment has spread around Conception Bay predicting a demolishing of the Coaker-Hickman forces there.

No wonder they are in a frenzied condition of absolute hopelessness, no wonder they recognize the game is up and that Monroe will sweep the country.

COMMITTEE MEETING LAST NIGHT

A meeting of the Haig Regatta Committee was held at the Great War Veterans' Association Headquarters last night. The veteran Arthur Haddock was in the chair. Reports from the Boat Clubs stated that the racers were all in good condition and would be available for practice next week. The wharves will be put out on Monday and a bandstand will also be erected. It is proposed to hold band concerts at the course whilst boats are practicing. The Haig races promise to be the most exciting held in recent years. There are seven races on the programme. Great interest is centred in the International Ex-Service and Inter-District Races. H. M. S. Conception, a French, and probably an American warship, will be in port and the crews will race in ship's boats. Crews from Bonavista, Conception, and other Bays, have signified their intention of competing in the Inter-District Race, which promises to be keenly contested. It is probable that this race will be run off in ship's boats. From now until July, a Committee will meet every Friday night.

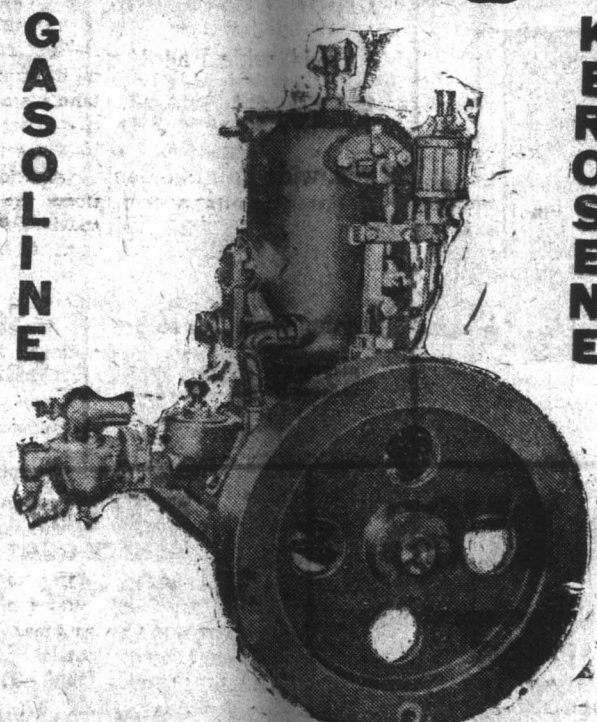
