James Parton, of Boston, (Mass.,) having left off smoking, has suddenly become inspired with an all-absorbing mania for proselytising, and has written a book of 151 pages, with a view of proving that the use of tobacco in however moderate a quantity must, of necessity, be injurious, and in effect endorsing the opinion, somewhat coarsely expressed by our so much respected but rather dogmatic friend Horace Greely, that "when a man begins to smoke he becomes a hog."
