

COMMERCIAL TREATY WITH FRANCE.
The Anglo-French Commercial Treaty of 1860 will expire February next, but a new one has just been signed. It is generally complained in England that President Thiers has had nearly all his own way. The conditions of the new treaty may be summarized thus: The tariff of the treaty of 1860 to remain in force, with the addition of protective duties equivalent to the taxes paid on raw materials by the French producers. Differential shipping duties to be abolished by France, except in her existing trade. Complete freedom gained by England in respect of her own duties on wine, coal and all other imports and exports. A general reform in the method of settling custom-house disputes, both as to classification and value. Either France or England is to have power to abrogate the treaty or any provisions thereof by giving twelve months notice. The new treaty to remain in force till the expiration of the treaty with Austria on the 1st of January, 1877, after which England shall enjoy the most favored national treatment in respect of any treaty subsequently contracted.

STORM ON LAKE SUPERIOR.—The Duluth, Minnesota gives an account of a terrific storm which occurred on Lake Superior on the 15th inst. The breakwater at Duluth was partially carried away, sustaining damages to the extent of \$50,000. After the breakwater had been destroyed two vessels in the harbour were wrecked, and a propeller and rig sustained serious damage. This is said to have been one of the severest storms ever known on Lake Superior, and a large number of wrecks and disasters are reported. The loss is estimated at \$125,000.

NUMEROUS instances of exalted heroism occurred during the Boston fire. Here is one: A brave fellow crowded into a cellar and let off the steam from three over-pressured boilers, which threatened to burst instantaneously. It was so hot that his comrades kept two streams of water playing on him while he was performing this dangerous duty.

Miss Emily Faithful will leave Chicago in a few days on her way to Milwaukee. Among other projects with which her active philanthropy seeks to ameliorate the condition of her countrymen, is that of a higher and better education. She is particularly desirous of studying the success of, and experiments in, the condition of the sexes, and will for that purpose visit the University of Michigan, which admits women to its Medical Department, Cornell University, Oberlin College, and other institutions.
