

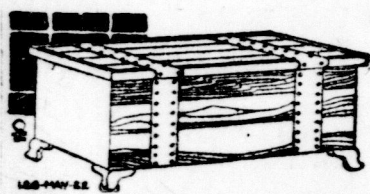

FARMERS FIGHT THUGS IN WOOD

Two Bank Bandits Shot To Death by Posse of 500 Farmers.

Fugitives Trapped in Woods Wage Desperate Battle For Liberty.

ORTONVILLE, Mich., June 1.—Two of four bandits who this morning robbed the States Savings Bank at Metamora of \$6,500 were shot to death, and the two others captured this afternoon by a posse of 500 armed farmers.

All the stolen money was recovered. More than a thousand shots—from revolver, rifle and shotgun—were exchanged in the battle that followed the trapping of the bandits in a 1,000-acre wood, known as Coleman's Woods, near Davidson Lake, a few miles southeast of Metamora. One of the captured bandits and one of the posse were wounded, the latter probably fatally.

The robbery of the bank occurred shortly after 9 a.m. The four bandits, looking like farmers in their broad-rimmed straw hats and faded blue overalls, drove up to the bank in a green touring car. Two remained outside, while two entered the bank. Only two employees, the cashier and the assistant cashier, were in the bank.

Pour Money Into Bag.
Neither bandit uttered a word, but one slipped a paper toward the cashier, on which was scrawled:

"Do not speak or you will die."
When the bank official looked up he was confronted with a revolver. He and his assistant were driven into the vault and locked in. The robbers gathered up all the money in sight, which they poured into a grain bag, and fled to their automobile. As they drove away they were shot at by several citizens whose suspicions had been aroused by the conduct of the men who waited in the car.

Local officers commandeered an automobile and gave chase to the robbers, while citizens began organizing a posse. Farmers all over the countryside responded eagerly to the alarm, and the posse soon numbered 500 determined men, all of them armed.

So closely pressed were the bandits that they abandoned their car a few miles from Metamora and took to the thick woods at Davidson Lake. Here two farmers, working in their fields, saw the bandits running in pairs, each pair carrying a big bag. The leading pair abandoned their bag, which was found filled with cartridges, and fled into the thicket.

One Bandit Surrenders.
The second pair were carrying the bag containing the loot when the posse spread through the woods in all directions. Leo Cummings, cashier of a bank at Goderich, and George Whitley, also of Goderich, at the head of the posse fired on the pair and were fired on in turn. A second volley from the pursuers brought down one of the bandits and caused the other to surrender.

The wounded man gave the name of Mike Kolski, 30 years old, of Flint. He had been shot through the right leg. His companion gave the name of Jerry Skopendy, 35, of Detroit. Both were turned over to a guard while the search continued for the other two bandits.

Fight To The Death.
This led the posse into the very heart of the woods. Here the two bandits, both armed with automatic rifles, exchanged volley after volley with their pursuers, who fought from behind the cover of trees and brush. The battle raged almost an hour—then a silence from the bandits that signified the end.

In a pool of blood lay their bodies. Each riddled by bullets. Beside them were their guns and a large quantity of empty shells.

At 4 p.m. neither bandit had been identified. In the pocket of one, however, a scrap of paper was found bearing the name "A. Amstley."







MAN SLEEPS WITH HIS BED IN FLAMES

Guelph Citizen Rescued by Prompt Action of Fire-men.

GUELPH, June 1.—Ben Mills, a boarder of the Western Hotel, had a rather thrilling experience at an early hour this morning when he was carried from his bedroom in a half dazed condition by members of local fire brigade who had been called to

extinguish a blaze which had broken out shortly before 2 o'clock. The alarm was raised by Constable John Tevens, of the police force, who while making his rounds at the early hour, observed some smoke issuing from a third story window in the hotel. He immediately summoned the fire department, and when Chief Knighton and his men arrived on the scene, they discovered Mills lying in bed, with flames creeping along the bed clothes toward him. The room was filled with smoke, and it was only the quick action of the fire fighters in rescuing the man from the burning room that saved his life. The blaze was extinguished with chemicals and little damage resulted. Mills was none the worse of his experience today.






