Goes To Ryerson First Grade.

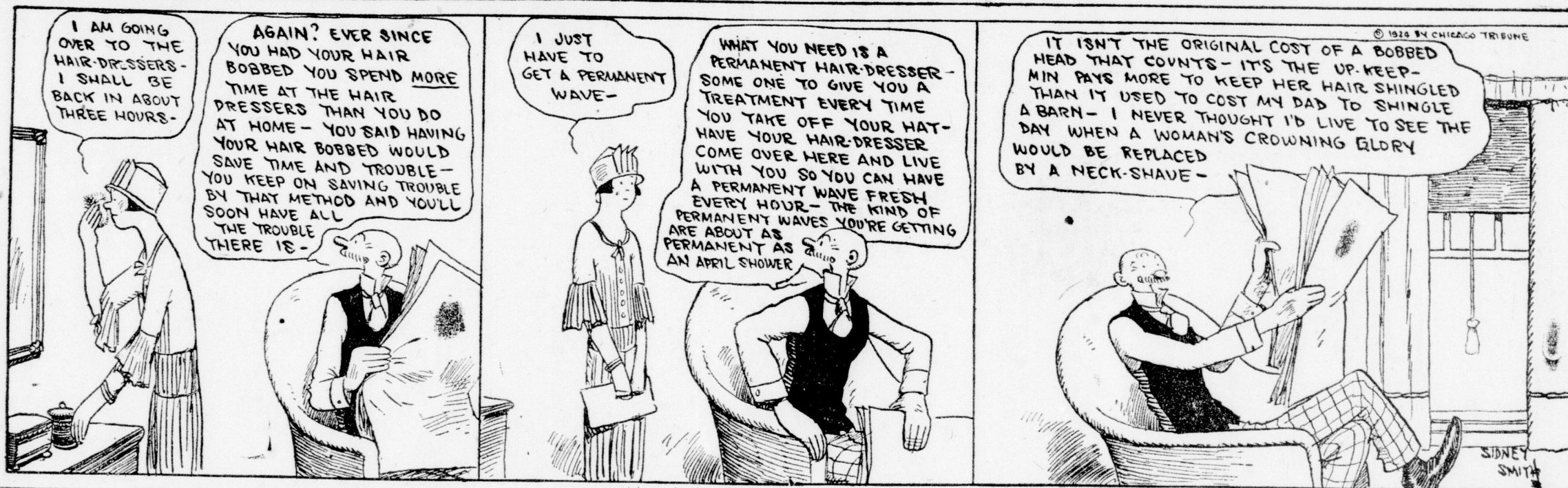

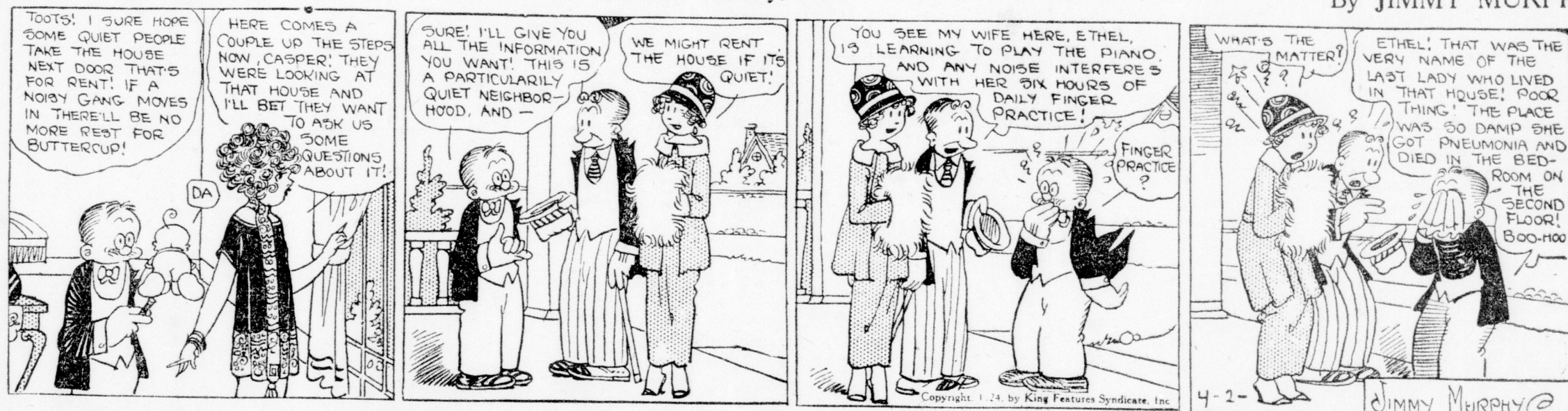
