Timely Blows With Dresden Misplays Give Cats 8-1 Win

SIXTH DECIDED TILT

St. Thomas, Sept. 1.—The Saints evened up the senior O. B. A. play-off series at Pinafore Park today, when they beat Dresden 8 to 1 before a crowd of 400 spectators. The Saints combined ten hits with seven visiting misplays for their victory.

A rally in the sixth of three runs made the game secure.

A coin was tossed up to decide where the next game would be played, with the result that the final game will be staged in Chatham Saturday afternoon.

Monk Went Routed.
Monk pitched the entire game for the Saints and Wallace started for Dresden. Wallace was pulled in the sixth after he had let in three runs, and was exchanged with Babbitt in left field. Wall was struck by a pitched ball in the fourth, and his position at second base was taken over by Craig.

The combined forces of Wallace and Babbitt had three strike-outs to their credit, as did Monk, and had it not been for the support given the latter a different story might have been told. McMillen, the only man to score for the visitors, singled in the fifth, stole second, and covered two bases for a counter on Wallace's drive to center field.

Monk opened the scoring for St. Thomas in the third, when he got a life as the winning first baseman stepped off the bag. Rieborough sacrificed him to second and he came in on Lindsay's single, the latter going to second on the throw in, and to third when the catcher pegged wild to center.

Lindsay scored in the fifth when he drew a walk, stole second and came home on Binnie's long drive to center field.

The sixth inning gave the game to the Saints. Binnies singled, stole second and came home on Evans' single. Evans crossed to second on an error to Miller, and came home on Graham's single. An error and a stolen base got Graham to third base fanned, but Rieborough produced a single which brought Graham home. Babbitt replaced Wallace then and Lindsay and Arlein failed to get a hit. Barclay was hit by a pitched ball in the seventh, stole second and came home on a wild pitch which gave Evans a walk. Arlein scored a run, a sacrifice bunt in the eighth, which gave the Saints their final run.
