ANOTHER INSTANCE

The town of Staunton, Virginia, is quoted as an illustration of the advantages derived from conducting the affairs of a city as one would conduct those of a large business concern. Staunton could not adopt the commission plan in full, because an article in the constitution of the state made it necessary for each city to have an advisory board. The people, however, went as far as they could and abolished the old system of civic committees having charge of the various departments of the city government. A general manager was appointed who was given entire charge and control of all the executive work of the city in its various departments, and full control of the heads of departments and employees of the city. He was also clothed with authority to make all contracts for labor and supplies and to perform all the administrative and executive work previously performed by the several standing committees, except the finance ordinance and auditing committees. A very able man appears to have been elected as the first general manager. For at the end of the first year his salary was increased \$500. The people pronounced the new system a complete success, and say that it has produced better results than were anticipated by its most enthusiastic supporters.

"think," which is that somebody is doing everything possible to hold up the affairs of the town, evidently to the intentional detriment of the new council and its officers. "A hold-up" is certainly the correct expression, for it could not be more lawless were it done over the head of a Western Road Agent's "shootin' iron," and it does seem disgraceful that people in a civilized community should act in such a disgusting way. However, in all this there shows up the obvious want of a party composed of defeated sore-heads who seem to have made it their chief aim and end in life since the accession of a new governing body in Dalhousie to block the progressive ideas and acts of Mayor Stewart and his Council. However, it is good to see that the Council is not in the least intimidated by those methods, and although the present council has as much desire to plume itself on getting through without recourse to the law, as the defunct council evidently did, they would not feel over the neglect of the town's welfare on account of a fear of the consequences of legal proceedings. In other words the Town Council is determined that "right shall be right" and that the best interests of the rate-payers will be safeguarded throughout. Solicitor Trueman gave the council all his advice on the matter and referred to, and we think that his opinion is quite coincident with our own. He seemed to regard this as an outrage and asked whether it would be anything cropping up in the books after the Town Council has surrendered the bond, would they have to fall back upon, and what would the rate-payers think of a council which would allow itself to be fleeced out of its own property. Do the promoters of this "Money Business" not know that this "hold-up" is not a "right" but a "wrong"? After much discussion this matter was given into the hands of a Committee composed of Aldermen Scott and Mercier, and the Mayor, and they were instructed to proceed to a definite end in consultation with the solicitor, Mr. Trueman.
