Provisions of Hon. Mr. Devlin's Bill—His References to The Business Here

Quebec, Nov. 27—Hon. Mr. Devlin's bill for the protection of foxes and othe furbearing animals kept in captivity prohibits strangers from approaching the enclosures of farms for fur-bearing animals beyond a distance of twenty-five yards under a penalty not exceeding \$50 and not less than \$5, and in default to imprisonment not exceeding \$50 and not less than one month. A heavier fine is fixed by the new law for anyone who shall plass within the enclosure where the animals are kept, who shall lcimb over or break or cut through the enclosure. For

kept, who shall climb over or break or cut through the enclosure. For this offence the fine is at a maximum of \$100 and a minimum of \$50 or imprisonment of not more than six and not less than two months.
