A GREAT FIRE IN LONDON.

Twe Persons Killed While Escaping from the Eurning Building.

London, Aug. 6.—Whiteley's enormous drapery and general stores and warehouses in West-Bourne Grove and Queen's-road, Paddington, were partially destroyed by fire. The pecuniary damage is placed at \$1,250,000. It is believed that there was no insurance on the property. This circumstance is said to be due to the occurrence of previous suspicious fires in the establishments own dby the firm.

A dreadful accident occurred while the fire was in progress. Several of the Whiteley employes and a score of firemen were crossing a en bridge which connected one of the burning buildings with another, when the structure collapsed and threw its occupants down into the street, a distance of fifty feet. Three of the surplives and a score of firemen were killed outright. All the others received terrible injuries, some of which it is thought, will prove fatal.
