

It is probably not generally known that there are agricultural settlers taking up lands there now; and, as there are stretches of good land, these settlers could probably make a better living than settlers in the Muskoka and Rhillburton Free Grant Districts if the district is really rich in minerals, as they would have a

Seeing, then, that the country is one of good promise and of immense possibilities, fels surely important that the best means at our disposal should be taken for isdevelopment.
