To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that at the expira-tion of one month from the date hereof the Council of the Corporation of the City of Teronto will pass the following bylaw for the extension of Sherbourne-street northerly from the present terminus thereof across the Rosedale Ravine and for the construction of in iron bridge across the said ravine:

PROPOSED BYLAW for the extension of Sherbourne-street nor-therly from the present terminus thereof across the Rosedale Ravine and for the con-struction of an iron bridge across the said ravine.

Whereas by Report No. 31, of the Committee on Works, 1889, as amended by Report No. 32 of the said Committee, adopted in Council on the 9th day of December last, it is recommended that an iron bridge with stone abutments and iron piers according to a plan prepared by the City Engineer, a copy of which is hereto annexed, marked "B" should be constructed across the Resedale Ravine at the head of Sherbourne-street, and that Sherbourne-street should be extended northerly from the northerly limit of Bloor-street, as shewn on the plan hereto annexed, marked "A. And whereas in the opinion of this Council, the constructing of the said bridge will benefit the municipality at large and it is inequitable to raise the whole cost thereof by local special assessment, and whereas no sufficiently signed petition special assessment.


