Mr. and Mrs. Morton, of Trinidad, spent a few days in $\mathrm{T}_{\mathrm{O}}$. ronto on their way to the Maritime Provinces. They delivered interesting addresses at a meeting in Knox Church on Tuesday evening, the 30th July. Mr. Morton's health is mach improved.

We are informed by the Secretary of the Foreign Mission Committee that Mr. McGillivray has gone to Lin Ching to prepare native houses for some of the stati. They can rent native houses at a low cost, but require to spend a good deal upon them to make them habitable for the missionaries. Dr. Mcclure also spoke of the great heat. The temperature even in April had risen to $97^{\circ}$ and $98^{\circ}$, accompanied with hot winds, and they were led to expect a season of weeks when it would be over $100^{\circ}$. Nevertheless they seem able to stand it, and are all well.
