The Secretary of the Province of Ontario will receive Tenders to be addressed to him at the Parliament Buildings, Toronto, and marked "Tenders for Coal," up to noon of FRIDAY, 16th May, 1884,

ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, TORONTO.—Hard coal, 2,000 tons large egg size, 175 tons stove size. Soft coal, 400 tons.

CENTRAL PRISON, TORONTO.—Hard coal, 60 tons nut size. Soft coal, 500 tons.

REFORMATORY FOR FEMALES, TORONTO.—Hard coal, 1,000 tons egg size, 25 tons stove size. Soft coal, 475 tons.

ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, LONDON.—Hard coal, 180 tons large egg size, 30 tons chestnut size. Soft coal, 1,700 tons for steam purposes, and 150 tons for grates.

ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE, KINGSTON.—Hard coal, 1,300 tons egg size, and for gas making purposes 700 tons best Lehigh, large egg size.

An accepted cheque for \$500, payable to the order of the Secretary of the Province of Ontario, must accompany each tender, as a guarantee of its bona fides, and two sufficient sureties will be required for the due fulfilment of each contract.
