MISCELLANEOUS.

QUEEN OF PUDDINGS,—Beat together the jolks of four eggs, one teacup of brown sugar and grated rind of a lemon; stir this into one juit of grated bread crumbs, and over the whole pour a quart of boiling milk. But this in a publing dish, and take a light frown When quite cold, spread over the pudding a thick layer of currant july, plum jelly, risportly jelly, or something, if the kind. Then cover the whole with a meringue made of the whites of the eggs, four tablespoonfuls of white sugar and the juice of the lemon. Set in the stove and bake a light brown; serve cold with cream. QUEEN OF PUDDINGS, -- Beat together the cold with cream.




