WELLAND CANAL ENLARGEMENT. NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned and endorsed "Tender for the Welland Canal" will be received at the office until the arrival of the Eastern and Western Mails on MONDAY, the 21st day of JANUARY next (1886), for raising the walls of the locks, water-lift, and increasing the height of the banks of that part of the Welland Canal between Fort Dalhousie and Thorold, and for deepening the Hemlock Level between Thorold and Hamar's Bend, near Hamar's Bend.

The works, the nature of which will be set in Sections. Maps of the several localities, together with plans and descriptive specifications, can be seen at this office on and after MONDAY, the 11th day of JANUARY next (1886), where printed forms of tender can be obtained. A list of names of information relative to the works north of Allanburg will be furnished at the Resident Engineer's Office, Toronto; and for works south of Allanburg, at the Resident Engineer's Office, Welland.

Contractors are requested to bear in mind that tenders will not be considered unless made safely in accordance with the printed forms, and, in the case of firms, except there are attached the actual signatures, the nature of the occupation and place of residence of each member of the firm, and further, an accepted bank cheque for the sum of Two Thousand Dollars or more—according to the extent of the work on the section—must accompany the respective tenders, which sum shall be retained if the party tendering declines entering into contract for the work, at the rates stated in the offer submitted. The amount required in each case will be stated on the form of tender.

The cheque or money thus sent in will be returned to the respective parties whose tenders are not accepted.
