

LUMBER.

There were only three charters during the past month for Australia from the entire coast, which is ample evidence of the very depressed state of the Australian market, for if the trade were in a healthy state, fifteen charters would be more like the record. South America is about filled up as considerable tonnage is loading and under charter. The Brit. bark (new) Toboggan, 676 tons, now at Callao, has been chartered to load at the Hastings Mills for Wilmington, Deleware. She will arrive in May. The Mount Carmel, on the way with sugar, is under charter for Valparaiso, but loading port has not been announced. There were three arrivals during the week -the Riversdale to load for Sydney, the Craigend for Iquiqui and Callao and the Mistletoe for the Wilmington Deleware shipyard. The Angerona sailed on the 20th for Valparaiso for orders, with a cargo of 831,937 feet rough valued at \$7,095. The Agnes which sailed on the 20th from Chemainus for Antofagasta, took 440,939 feet rough, 157,070 feet t and g flooring and 50 bdls. laths, valued at \$6,413. The Czar has finished for Australia, and the Kathinka is expected to finish early in the week. The cargo of the Dominion loaded for Adelaide, is advertised for sale by auction at Esquimalt. Quotations are as follows for cargo lots for foreign shipment, being the prices of the Pacific Pine Lumber Association: Rough merchantable, ordinary sizes, in lengths to 40 feet, inclusive, \$9 per M feet; rough deck plank, average length 35 feet, \$19; dressed flooring, \$17; pickets, \$9; laths, 4 feet, \$2.
