Hon. C. M. Drury (Minister of Industry): In answer to parts (a) through (d) the following statistics are based upon active applications received by the area development agency as of September 1, 1967, and refer only to

establishments participating under the area development program. Active applications include those that have been approved or are under review but do not include applications that have been rejected. The statistics relate to all areas that have been designated under the program since its beginning, July 1963, including those areas that have been de-designated.

The Okanagan and Kootenay Indian agencies were amalgamated in 1966 under the new name "Kootenay-Okanagan agency". The following table shows the names of the bands, the reserves they hold and the approximate on-reserve population of each reserve located within the boundaries of the Kootenay-Okanagan agency:
