DEFENCE INDUSTRY PRODUCTIVITY PROGRAM**Question No. 168—Mr. Stackhouse:**

In 1983, what were the total expenditures of the Defence Industry Productivity Program including salaries, publicity and grants?

Hon. Sinclair Stevens (Minister of Regional Industrial Expansion): The defence Industry Productivity Program (DIPP) expenditures for the fiscal year 1983-84 were as follows:

Contributions:	\$144,231,855
Loans:	\$ 534,389

The related expenses for DIPP for the fiscal year 1983-84 totalled approximately \$2.5 million. This figure is made up of salaries for personnel evaluating and processing projects, contract costs, assets management and audit costs. There are no publicity costs for DIPP. However, a press release is prepared to inform the public of commitments made by the Government and the salaries related to this activity are included in the above figure.
