A Message was received from the Senate, agreeing to the Address to His Excellency the Governor General, expressive of the deep regret at His Excellency's approaching departure from Canada, etc.;—and stating that they have filled up the blank with the words "Senate and."

Also,—agreeing to the amendments made by this House to the following Bills of their own, without amendment, viz.:—

Bill No. 124 intituled: "An Act respecting the High Court of Justice for Ontario."

Bill No. 91 intituled: "An Act to amend and consolidate the Acts relating to the Superannuation of persons employed in the Civil Service of Canada;"—and

Bill No. 111 intituled: "An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws relating to Penitentiaries."

Also,—agreeing to the following Bills, without amendment, viz. :-

Bill No. 132 respecting the sale of Intoxicating Liquors, and the issue of Licenses therefor.

Bill No. 131 to encourage the manufacture of Pig Iron in Canada, from Canadian Ore.

Bill No. 119 further to amend the Tariff of Duties of Customs.

Bill No. 138 to provide for advances to be made, by the Government of Canada, to "The Saint John Bridge and Railway Extension Company."

Bill No. 143 to extend to British Columbia the Act relating to Fishing by Foreign Vessels,—and

Bill No. 133 to continue for a limited time the Acts therein mentioned.

Also,—agreeing to the Bill No. 127 to further amend the Consolidated Railway Act, 1879, and to declare certain lines of Railway to be works for the general advantage of Canada, with amendments. (On motion of Sir John A. Macdonald, the said amendments were taken into consideration, and concurred in).
