Attention Mr. John Lane

Dear Sirs:-

On September 19th I forwarded a telegram to Mr. John Lane addressed to the National Club, Toronto. This telegram read as follows:-

" McGill will guarantee to take 1500
" copies Macmillan's book at two
" dollars per copy, providing books
" are here by October thirteenth
" next. Address them to Lomer, our
" Librarian."

The story of the arrival of these books is as follows:-

On October 11th the Librarian received a letter from Mr. John Lane saying that he was sending 100 copies by one of Mr. Murray Gibbon's staff. The Library received these copies delivered by Mr. Max Enos of the New York Office of the Canadian Pacific Railway.

On October 14th Mr. Lane wrote to Mrs. Glasco, who has no connection whatever with McGill University, stating that the day before he had sent off 500 copies of the McGill book and that tomorrow, which would be the 15th, the remaining copies would go.
