Private. P.S. - 1. I quite appreciate the enquiries which you must make, but please do not make it appear as if I had sent in a formal application for the position, which I am not doing. If I were to do this, it would be necessary, I think, for me to resign here first. I know you will appreciate my point. I do not want to be disloyal or underhand with anyone. A direct offer from Sir Arthur would, however, be an entirely different matter, and would be the same position over again as when I received the invitation from here. I had heard from Haldane beforehand, but never had time to answer before the formal letter from the Principal arrived. If the invitation should come from Sir Arthur, I would much appreciate it if a definite statement could be made about -1. Scope of work and position. 2. Salary, etc. 3. Pension, if any, and if not, state so.

- 4. Time of retirement.
- 5. Anything else of importance in regard to the present and future.

You will notice that my publications only cover the past ten years; I thought that would be sufficient for your purpose.
