

BY-LAWS
OF THE
Mechanics' Institute and Athenaeum.

APPROVED 2ND OCTOBER, 1867.

ARTICLE I.

OF MEMBERS.

The members shall consist of four classes, viz :—Ordinary, Life, Corresponding, and Honorary.

ARTICLE II.

ORDINARY MEMBERS.

Ordinary members shall consist of those who shall sign the Constitution, and who shall pay as follows :—

1st.—Merchants and Professional men, Four Dollars per annum.

2nd.—Mechanics, whether Master Mechanics or otherwise, Clerks, Apprentices, and Employees generally, Two Dollars per annum.

These to be entitled to all the privileges of the Society.

ARTICLE III.

LIFE MEMBERS.

Life Members shall consist of contributors of fifty dollars (£12 10s), who shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Society.

ARTICLE IV.

CORRESPONDING MEMBERS.

Corresponding Members shall be chosen from among non-residents, who are favorable to the cause for which this Society was instituted. They shall be entitled to all the privileges of this Society, except the right of voting at meetings. They shall be elected by the Trustees, notice having been given, in writing, at least one month before.
