

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS—Places the Mace on the Table on return of the House from the Legislative Council, after hearing the Speech from the Throne, 31—Announces the Usher of the Black Rod, page 25—To take Strangers into custody, if in parts of the House appropriated to Members, 68—Members not attending at Calls of the House, to be taken into custody of the Serjeant, 77—Introduces Senators &c., when attending to be examined, 270.

SPEAKER OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY—*Absence of Speaker*—On absence of Speaker, for forty eight hours, House elects an Acting Speaker, page 17—When Speaker finds it necessary to leave the Chair, he calls any Member thereto, page 17.

*Address*—Duty of Speaker, when Address presented by the Whole House, 303, 309, 310.

*Business of the House*—Speaker, when they are reached, directs Clerk to read the Orders of the Day, without any Question put, 93.

*Committees of the Whole House*—Leaves the Chair on House going into Committee, 199, 200—Appoints a Chairman, page 75—The Mace then put under the
