The Woman's Auxiliary which admirable rganization of ladies has charge of the maintenance and management of the domestic affairs of the hospital as well as of the "Phillips" school for the training of nurses has also incurred a debt of some \$800 00. The experience of the Auxiliary shows that the summer months of the year, are those in which revenue falls off materially, while the diminuition of expenses during the same period is comparatively Inconsiderable. Contributions toward the extinction of this debt or for the maintenance of the hospital which latter may either be in money or supplies will be exceedingly acceptable.
