Press.)—A sign of the impending tariff war between the United States and Russia is seen in the presence in Ottawa today of Theodore Kryshoforich, Russian government agricultural commissioner from St. Louis, Mo., who is here by order from his government to interview the Canadian ministers and Canadian manufacturers with a view to developing further Canada's trade in agricultural implements with Russia.
