The Hospital for Incurables held its annual meeting yesterday afternoon, Mr. Ambrose Kent presiding. The report of the superintendent, Miss Cook, stated that the hospital had cared for 314 patients during the year; corded. In the institution 40 patients have to be fed three times daily, over 150 have to be bathed, dressed and lifted into chairs, 70 are altogether incompetent to serve themselves and have to be waited upon hand and foot.
