A Coffee Ring Started.

New York, Sept. 27.—Announcement was made to-day by The Journal of Commerce that the financing of Brazil's coffee valorization plan had been arranged. Bankers and merchants, internationally known and all identified with the coffee business, are named, who will advance the money needed—about \$20,000,000. They are located in New York, London, Havre and Hamburg. The object of the coffee valorization plan is to maintain coffee at a remunerative price to the grower by establishing a minimum quotation, at which it is to be upheld by purchases of coffee on account of the three coffee states of Brazil, namely the states of Sao Paulo, Rio and Minas, Interest on the loan made is guaranteed and paid by a tax on every bag of coffee shipped.

The contracting states bind themselves to restrict or discourage, by discriminating taxation, the exportation of coffee of inferior grades, and they further bind themselves to pass laws preventing the extension of coffee acreage for two years after Jan. 1, 1907, Leading Wheat Markets.

It is coming to be recognized by traders that a turn on the long side is of the utmost difficulty. The condition of the market and its need for false stimulants to trading was witnessed to-day in the supposed news of a devastating tidal witnessed to-day in the supposed news of a devastating tidal wave at New Orleans, and its later denial. This market is in an excellent position to leave alone until the buying can be classed as better than the selling.
