OPPOSED BY MERCHANTS.

o-Operative Societies, They Say, Would Destroy Trade.

Ottawa, March 7 .- (Special.) -- Secretary Prowern of the Dominion Retail Merchants' Association appeared to-day before the special committee of the house of commons in opposition to the industrial and co-operative societies' bill.

Mr. Trowern held that to give to the farmers and laboring people the opportunity to combine with the assistance of capital from the municipalities or corporations would seriously affect regular trade. The scheme was intended to get people together for the purpose of forming associations with the view of giving dividends as a tran for uneducated people who knew a trap for uneducated people who knew nothing about commerce. He pointed to the results of co-operation in Scotland, as showing that the wholesale and retail merchants' trade had been practically destroy-

ed.

J. A. Beaudry, treasurer of the Dominion Association of Retailers, opposed the bill, because societies such as were proposed would not be financially sound and their failure would have the effect of injurior. their failure would have the effect of injuring the general credit of Canada.

W. L. Mackenzie King, deputy minister
of labor, called as a witness, said that the
