SOUTH AMERICANS EAGER TO DON GOLD BRAID AGAIN

United States and Mexico Trying to Soothe Ruffled Republicans, Who Clamor for War

Washington, March 7.—Mexico and the United States are using their kindly offices in an attempt to effect a settlement of the trouble which threatens to involve all five of the Central American republics in war.

Mr. Creel, the Mexican ambassador, had a long conference with United States Secretary of State Root today.

Mr. Calvo, the Costa Rican minister, also called at the state department, but there were no late advices, and no new developments in the situation to-day.

The impression is still general in diplomatic circles that Salvador, Guatemala and Costa Rica are about to throw their support to Honduras, in an attempt to crush Nicaragua and humble President Zelaya.

It can be stated positively that there is no thought of sending a military expedition to the United States, and Mexico is believed to be unwilling to interfere.

Although strong efforts are being made for an arbitration of the grievances, which threaten to result so disastrously, the opinion prevails in Washington that the United States will all be involved in actual war.

HOURS FOR CHILD LABOR.

Dr. Helen McMurchy Says 30 Hours a Week for Those Under 16.

Dr. Hodggets and Dr. Helen McMurchy gave expert testimony to the special committee of the legislature on child labor yesterday.

Evidence of great physical injury in the stunting of the growth and of mental injury to children from early labor was quoted by Dr. McMurchy from high authorities.

She advocated a uniform law for boys and girls in factories and stores, those under 16 to work no more than 30 hours a week and not at night.

Dr. Hodggets compared the child labor laws of European countries and the United States with those of the provinces, which are antiquated.

OPPOSED BY MERCHANTS. Co-Operative Societies, They Say, Would Destroy Trade.

Ottawa, March 7.—(Special.)—Secretary of the Dominion Retail Merchants' Association appeared today before the special committee of the house of commons in opposition to the industrial and co-operative societies' bill.

Mr. Brown stated that to give to the farmers and laboring people the opportunity to combine with the assistance of capital from the municipalities or corporations would seriously affect rural trade.

The scheme was intended to get people to form co-operative societies, which would do nothing about commerce. He pointed to the results of co-operation in Scotland, as showing that the wholesale and retail merchants' trade had been practically destroyed.

A. A. Beaudry, treasurer of the Dominion Association of Retailers, opposed the general credit of Canada. The proposed would not be financially sound, and their failure would have the effect of injuring the general credit of Canada.

W. L. Mackenzie-King, deputy minister of labor, called as a witness, said that the best known economists of the world, among them John Stuart Mill, Ruskin, Herbert Spencer, and others, had all been in favor of the co-operative system.

It was only natural that there should be opposition from the middlemen. The co-operative system would be a godsend to the civil servants, he said.

REFUSE TO ARBITRATE. Brewery Workers Decline the Offer of the Employers.

A conference yesterday between the master brewers and the employees' representatives failed to effect an agreement in regard to the demand for increased wages.

The union has asked for a general increase of \$1.50 a week. The employers have offered an increase of 50 cents, 75 cents and \$1, according to grades, with a week's work of 50 hours in winter.

The employers also made a written offer to submit the question of hours and wages to arbitration, which the employees were to accept only on condition that they were to be paid for their time during the arbitration.

It is only a matter of time since their wages were increased by arbitration and the refusal now would indicate a feeling that their case is a poor one.
