Robert Martin Locked Up by Police Old Man Acquitted of Serious Charge.

HAMILTON, Oct. 24.—(Special.)—Robert Martin, Bay and Cannon-streets, was locked up this afternoon charged with acting improperly in the presence of some little girls in Dundurn Park.

GERMANY'S SENSATION

IS THE HARDEN ACTION

Kaiser's Name Used in the Trial

BERLIN, Oct. 24.—The libel action brought by Gen. Count Kuno von Moltke, against Herr Maximilian Harden, editor of Die Zukunft, a freelance polemical weekly and long an organ of the editor's extreme radical opinions, began here today before Justice Kerna.

The public awaited the trial with extraordinary interest, because it was believed that many secrets of the imperial court would be drawn from the distinguished persons summoned to testify, some of whom are members of the imperial entourage.

According to report, the Crown Prince Frederick William made an enquiry about the plaintiff's views, and sent his father with the result of his investigation, which caused Prince zu Eulenburg, Count Kuno von Moltke and Lieut. Gen. Count Wilhelm von Hohenau, one of the emperor's adjutants, to write to the chancellor and members of the so-called Camarilla, or "round table," and he further alleged that they were spiritualists and of abnormal temperament.
