The shooting occurred before the residence of Mrs. Bya B. Althouse, widow of the late George Althouse, where Saxton is presumed to have gone to make a call. Five shots were fired, three of which entered his body, and Mrs. Anna C. George was placed under arrest on susplicion of the murder. Death was probably instantaneous, three bullets having entered viral spots. The position of the body indicated that he had just left the Althouse residence when the shots were fired. Saxton, who was annuarried, lived with M. C. Barber, a brother-in-law. Mr. Saxton left the Baber home a few minutes before the shooting, riding his bleycle, and this was the last seen of him by his friends.

The Woman in the Case.

Mrs. George is the divorced wife of Sample C. George, conducting a dressmaking business. Her divorce was obtained in Dakota, and a proceeding here being a suit for damages for the alleged allenation of the wife's affections. This case has been through all the intermediate courts, and was passed upon by the State Supreme Court on an inter-pleading, and finally remanded for hearing on its merits here. Before this occurred and on Wednesday a settlement was effected, Saxton paying George \$1825 on the claim set up of \$20,000 for damages. Mrs. George has also had several cases against Saxton, claiming the detention of furniture, the defence of Saxton being that the articles were held for overdue rent in the rooms.
