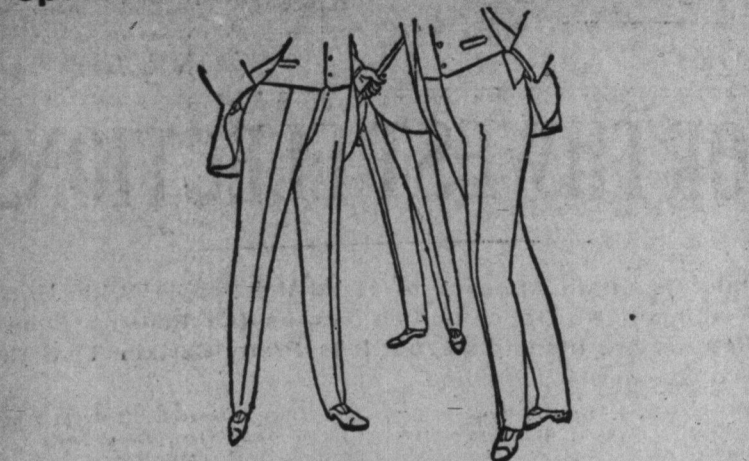

RESIDENTS ARE VERY ANGRY

Over the H. G. & B. Company Refusing to Sell Tickets.

"Pleasance" is the word the Saltfleet people use in regard to that Company's Action-Engineer Barrow's Recommendation for Distribution of Water-Immunization Notes.

Hamilton, Nov. 4.—(Special)—The residents of Saltfleet Township are angry over the action of the H. G. & B. Company in refusing to sell communication tickets to those of them who travel on the road. The Saltfleet people call the company's action "pleasance," and say they have a different idea of what the directors expect. Robert Millen and the township councilors are being supported in their stand against the railroad people, and as long as they stick to their guns, the Saltfleet people will be re-elected next January. The trouble has arisen through the Saltfleet Township Council bringing action against the H. G. & B. road, asking that the charter be forfeited, on the ground that it has violated its agreement in regard to the Red Hill crossing, near Stoney Creek. The company will fight the case, which will come up at this month's non-jury sittings.

Engineer Barrow's Recommendation. The Fire and Water Committee this evening gave special consideration to Engineer Barrow's proposal to improve the city's water distribution by building a new main along Barton street. According to Mr. Barrow's recommendation, the main would be divided into two districts, high and low level. The new main would be 30 inches on Sherman street and 20 inches from there through the city. The members of the committee appeared in favor of the scheme, and the committee decided to endorse the plan.

Still Striking On. The Court of Revision this afternoon and evening considered appeals from "widened" property owners and struck off \$8,647. Of this \$87,000 was for personality and machinery, on an appeal from Copp Bros., Brantford.

Want Equitable Assessment. The County Council, at its last session, passed a resolution concerning the law of mortgage assessment, and the County Clerk is now sending copies of it to the other municipalities.

TO REINFORCE DEWEY. Cruiser Buffalo Sails for Manila With 600 Men. New York, Nov. 4.—The cruiser Buffalo sailed from the navy yard today at noon for Manila. The Buffalo has on board 600 men, who are going to reinforce the forces of Dewey. She also has supplies of ammunition and stores on board.

Transport Pennsylvania Sails. San Francisco, Nov. 4.—The transport Pennsylvania, with the 51st Regiment Iowa volunteers on board, sailed last evening for Manila. The regiment numbers 128, officers and men, and the transport is in charge of Colonel Loper. Since the Iowa came to San Francisco deaths and discharges have reduced the ranks of the regiment by over 300 men.

TO RATIFY THE BYLAW. Arrangements for Installation of Incandescent System. Acton, Nov. 4.—The voting here today to ratify the bylaw to provide for manufacturing and supplying electric lighting by the corporation at an expense of six thousand was carried by a majority of 53. The Municipal Council will arrange at once for the installing of an adequate incandescent system for street lighting and commercial and domestic service, by a competent electric engineer, and will aim to have it successful operation by the new year.

FRENCH CHAMBER REOPENED

M. Dupuy Reads Ministerial Declaration Amid Great Animation.

Fully Recognizes Difficulty of the Task Undertaken—Arrangements for Discussion of Pasha's Question to Be Made—General Policy of the Government—Light for the Dreyfus Case.

Paris, Nov. 4.—The Chamber of Deputies re-opened today with a crowded assembly, after its adjournment on Oct. 23, the day of the fall of the Cabinet presided over by M. Briason. Amid great animation the Premier, M. Dupuy, read the ministerial declaration. He began by declaring the Cabinet fully recognized the difficulties of the position which it had undertaken and affirmed the supremacy of civil power, as the fundamental principle of a Republic, and expressed confidence in the army, which, he added, would faithfully respect the laws of the republic.
