Cheese Markets.

Cowara, June 10.—The weekly meeting of the Eastern Township Dairy Producers' Association was held at the premises of the Eastern Township Creamery, 1711 boxes of butter and 22 factories offered 1084 boxes cheese. Butter sales: McIntosh Co. bought 200 boxes, 19c; and 45 at 19c; James Alexander bought 50 at 19c; H. H. Hildbrand bought 40 at 19c; H. H. Hildbrand bought 40 at 19c; J. Bryce bought 80 at 19c; H. J. Allen bought 150 at 19c; Lovell & Christmas bought 40 at 19c; balance, 1184 boxes, 19c.

Cheese sales: Hodgson Bros. bought 215 at 19c; McIntosh Co. bought 200 boxes, 19c; Gunn-Langlois Co. bought 120 at 19c; D. A. McIntosh bought 121 at 19c.

Winkler Hill, Ont., June 10.—There were 1500 boxes of cheese headed here this afternoon. The board opened, and four of the buyers bid 9 1/2c and 9 3/4c. After several calls, Miller & Riley got one lot of 200 boxes, 9 1/2c; Lovell & Christmas got 175, Hodgson Bros. got 45 boxes; balance of salesmen did not sell. The board closed at 9 1/2c. It is reported that 50c was paid for all cheese sold on the street, Hodgson Bros. being the highest bidder. Six buyers were present—A. A. Ayer & Co., Hodgson Bros., Miller & Riley, Lovell & Christmas, James Dairypro and Langlois.
