JURY SPRINGS A SURPRISE. Convicts Two Men on Serious Charge Despite Judge's Remarks.

Notwithstanding the fact that the charge of Chief Justice Falconbridge was strongly in favor of the prisoners, the jury in the assize court hearing the criminal case against Reginaid Ross and Patrick Connolly of committing rape on Mrs. Ruby Heinson, yesterday returned a verdict of guilty.

His lordship said: "I would have hesitated a little before returning such a verdict, gentlemen, I'll have to consider what I will do about it."

Up to the time that Dr. Goldwin Howland began to give evidence for the crown the case against the prisoners looked pretty strong, but he testified that Mrs. Heinson had been suffering from mania.

Dr. Howland said that the woman had worked at his house as a servant. The conclusion I came to was that she was a highly nervous, mildly insane. She was the widow of an Anglican clergyman and spoke of her work with her husband, her life in India, and her social standing. She would pick men up on the street and write letters to them continually.

"Do you think her testimony given as to her treatment by these men is reliable?" asked Mr. Blackstock.

"Oh, I think so," said witness. "But that she made the advances or accepted the advances they made?" "I would judge so."

She had testified that the prisoners had assaulted her one evening after she had walked all the way from her employment uptown to Kew Beach, because she lacked the necessary car fare.

KILLED BABE TO QUIET IT. Kansas City Man Declared He Would Break Little Daughter's Temper.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Jan. 27.—John David Stewart was fired when he came home at night after his work. He had heard the clanging of tools and machinery all day, and quiet was what he wanted, but there was not quiet at his home.

A little girl ten months old was a part of the Stewart family. She cried quite frequently, after the manner of babies, when the father came home tired. So Stewart told his wife that she had assaulted the baby too much during the day to keep her quiet and thus made her cry in the evening.

But the baby kept on crying, night after night, and Stewart got angry. So he set out to "break its temper."

John David Stewart is strong. A child of ten months was but a flimsy bit of nothing in his hands. The fingers accustomed to hard work gripped too tightly for baby's comfort. And with those same strong hands Stewart choked the baby. He shook her hard one night and then slammed her down on the bed and told his wife to care for her.

Baby's temper was broken. So was her neck. The coroner and the doctors said Stewart killed his child, and the wife after that evening when the baby died went to the county jail. First degree murder was the charge against him.

To-day in criminal court Stewart withdrew his plea of not guilty to the charge and pleaded guilty to manslaughter in the fourth degree. His sentence in the penitentiary was two years.
