The report of the "Quebec Scheme Committee" was presented, and subsequently adopted in the following form:

"The Committee are glad to state that the Scheme has so far worked well, and to the advantage of the missionaries. The conditions have been fulfilled by the missions up to the end of the last half year, and in almost every case the wardens have been dealt with, and they have performed their part of the contract."

The Committee expressed their regret that the income of the Society would not permit an increase of any of the grants, and that the efforts to raise the minimum salary to \$800 must be delayed. They are, however, of opinion that in several cases the people are able to contribute more than they have hitherto done.

Upon the recommendation of the Committee, the following grants, on the conditions named, were made for three years, from Jan'y 1st, 1877:
