DETECTIVE TELLS

Bankers Hear William J. Burns at American Bankers' Association.

In his address to a group of America's foremost bankers, William J. Burns brought out a number of interesting points. It was the occasion of the annual convention of the American Bankers' Association. He spoke of the protective features of banking and emphasized the point that it is better to stop a crime before it is committed than to wait until after to "lock the door." With the co-operation of the bankers, he was sure a great many crimes against banks could be eliminated.

He said: In order to do this it

He said: In order to do this it becomes necessary to educate those who prey upon banks to know and understand that those who seek to detraud a bank will be brought to justice, prosecuted vigorously regardless of who they are, and no compromises made. In order to bring this about it is necessary that the bankers immediately report all of the depredations that are committed or attempted against their institutions, by report.
