Another gallant officer of the "Fighting 26th" New Brunswick Battalion has fallen in battle in the person of Lieutenant John Daniel Brock, son of Annie C. and the late F. W. G. Brock, of Rotherman John Say (N. B.)
News was received in the city on Saturday that Lieutenant Brock had been
killed in action on Sept. 15, while leading

And he cheered his heart with a song.


He has done his bit—he has given his life,
