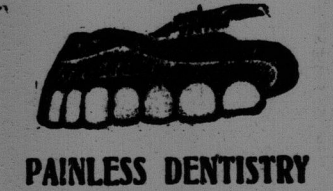

London, July 22—A despatch to Lloyd's from Durban, Natal, says the Peninsula and Oriental line steamer Benalla, previously reported afire at sea, will arrive at Durban on Friday. The crew has been unable to reach the fire, which is in No. 2 compartment. The Benalla, with 800 emigrants aboard, is being escorted by the steamer Otaki.
