XIII. That with that view, the Report of the Executive Committee of the 13th Synod, held in June 1872, be acted upon, as on and from the 1st of July in 1875, and reductions made in all those grants covered by the Report of the Lay Committee on Missions, dated 28th August 1871, and adopted by the Executive Committee on 30th August 1871, and subsequently confirmed by Synod, except as regards the special grants from the S. P. G. and the Clergy Trust Funds, which cannot be affected during the lives of the present recipients.

XIV. That all those missions so dealt with by the aforesaid Lay Committee's Report be informed that, from the 1st July 1875, the grants made will be annually reduced by one-tenth, so that they will entirely cease on 1st of July 1885.

XV. That in dealing with the list of missions ordered by the Synods of 1871 and 1872 to be reduced, the Executive Committee be authorized to settle and revise that list annually, at their discretion.

XVI. That strong efforts be also made, both in the city and country, to increase the general subscriptions to the Mission Fund, so that the Executive Committee may be in a position to make new grants when asked for by the Bishop, as he may consider desirable.

XVII. That in all future new grants, it be a condition that the grant be subject to a yearly or other reduction, so that the principle be kept steadily in view that the Church in each locality shall as rapidly as possible support itself.

The following are the Missions referred to in clauses vii, xiii and xiv:

Aylmer, Berthier, Brome, Bristol, Buckingham, Clarendon, Edwardstown, Grenville, Hemmingford, Huntingdon, Mascouche, North Gore, Onslow, Ormstown, Philipsburg, Portage du Fort, Rawdon, South Stukely, Terrebonne, West Farnham, West Shefford.

## GRANTS

Boscobel and North Ely.—An addition of \$100 for one year was made to this mission, and the grant is now \$500, commencing from 1st January 1875.

Mille Isles.—An addition of \$100 was made to this mission, and the grant, commencing from 1st April 1875, is now \$450.

Edwardstown.—An addition of \$50, which makes the grant from the Mission Fund to this mission \$200 from 1st April 1875.

New Glasgow and Kilkenny.—Grant of \$300 to be renewed on the appointment of a missionary, when the grant now paid to Terrebonne will be discontinued.

Papineauville.—A new mission, \$400.

Adamsville.—A new mission, \$400.

West Farnham.—To be reduced to \$150 from 1st July 1875.

Rev. W. Richmond, North Gore, \$300 to assist him in returning to England.
