Present-day American planes usually land at speeds ranging from forty-five miles an hour up, and require 500 yards of landing space.
The ship was designed by Emile Dewoitine, and is called the "Dewoitine motoraviette." It is being studied by army and navy experts with a view to adopting it for military use.

And for a total outlay of \$30, the New Yorker may commute to and from a bungalow in Los Angeles by means of the new "air flivver."
The "Flying Ford," as aviators have dubbed the miniature plane invented by Georges Barbot, French aviator, who has brought it to this country for

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APPEAL COURT
CONSIDERS CASES

Fredericton, N. B., June 6.—In John Sargeant vs. Smith, D. Mullin, K. C., for plaintiff moved for leave to enter and time to file factum, in the Appeal Court, June session, here yesterday. Leave was granted for next session.
In re estate of McDowell, G. Earle Smith moved for leave to enter and time to file factum. Court considers.
In Lois W. Franklin et al vs. Earle Ingersoll, G. Earle Smith moved to amend plaintiff's notice of appeal and for extension for time to enter and file factum; P. J. Hughes, K. C., contra. Application was dismissed with costs.
The King's Bench Division appeal paper was taken up. In Charrier vs. Fraser Companies, Limited, P. J. Hughes, K. C., for the plaintiff, moved to set aside order of Judge Barry giving direction as to third parties, R. B. Hanson, K. C., appeared for defendant company and J. B. Dickson for third parties admitting liability to defendant but not to plaintiff. The plaintiff in this action is a widow now residing in the United States, formerly living near Fredericton Junction. She is bringing action against Fraser Companies, Limited, for \$8,000 damages for entrance upon lands claimed to belong to her, John S. 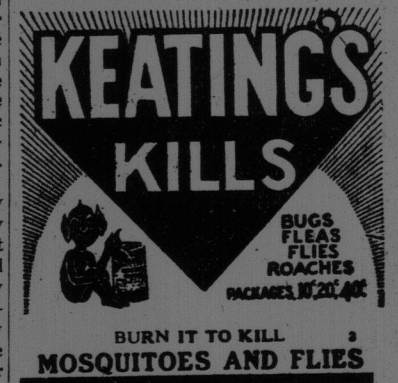
