\$50,000 IN WINE RUNS IN NEW YORK STREETS Children Try to Dip It Up as Forty-four Barrels Are Empty on Court Order—\$15,000 in Rum Dumped.

(New York Times.) Forty-four barrels of the Spanish and Italian wines were emptied into a sewer on the lower east side yesterday by government agents, and soon thereafter the United States marshal for this district emptied 1,400 quarts of whiskey, gin, brandy and other spirituous liquors into a sink in the warehouse of the Republic Storage Company, 634 Washington street. The wine was valued at \$80,000, and the other liquors were worth about \$15,000. Both lots were destroyed on court orders.

The wine flowed in the east side streets for a distance of a block and a half, and hundreds of children and a few adults in the neighborhood got buckets and what they could and tried to scoop up some of the stuff. One man, it was said, attempted to get away with a barrel before the agent John D. Appleby of Chief P. C. "Yellow" staff of general agents, who had charge of the operations.

The first vessel that came over after the Eighteenth Amendment went into effect with liquor in her cargo was the steamship Gothia, in March, 1919. Customs agents seized forty-four barrels of wine, which never were claimed. The wine had been kept in a warehouse at 214 South street. A court order was obtained yesterday which authorized the unusual public proceeding.

Smuggled Goods. The contraband liquors destroyed by United States Marshal Hecht had been seized aboard vessels in this port in connection with violations of the customs and Volstead laws. The court order for the destruction of the liquors was obtained by Assistant District Attorney J. H. Clark, Jr. Marshal Hecht broke the necks of the bottles and poured the contents into the sink.

BIG OPIUM DEN RAIDED. Chicago Police Arrest Thirty Chinese, Seize \$200,000 Worth of Drugs. Chicago, Dec. 14.—Thirty Chinese were arrested, thousands of dollars' worth of drugs confiscated and one of the most elaborate opium-smoking establishments ever discovered in Chicago broken up by a raid early today led by Inspector William H. Williams and a dozen assistants.

A small fire-story building on the northern fringe of Chicago's Chinatown had been remodeled, with scores of tiny rooms partitioned off on the upper floors. Repeated search of the labyrinthine passages disclosed caches of opium and opium shi, many Chinese still smoking and others just leaving rooms where smoking pipes had been stacked high with cans of opium. Most of the Chinese declared they had recently come from California and Oregon.

Several hours were occupied by the inspectors in searching the premises, and a truckload and a truckload was confiscated. Inspector Williams declared that at retail prices the seized drugs were valued at more than \$200,000.

Twenty opium pipes valued at \$100 each were taken. Seventy quarts of "moonshine" also were found. Inspector Williams and his assistants were busy today checking the identification papers of those seized in the raid in an effort to trace the source of the opium. The men will be charged with possessing smuggled opium, the penalty of which upon conviction is a fine of \$5,000 and two years' imprisonment.
