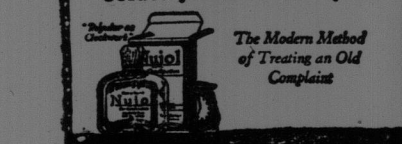

## THE PLEA FOR THE LOWER PROVINCES

Strong Delegation at Ottawa  
This Morning in Matter of  
Freight Rates—The Argument.

Halifax, N. S., June 1.—The industries of the maritime provinces must languish and die if freight rates on the Intercolonial section of the Canadian National Railways are to be fixed on a purely commercial basis and present a barrier against competition of maritime products in the markets of central and western Canada, is the declaration of Hon. R. E. Finn, minister without portfolio in the Nova Scotia government, who is one of the delegation from the maritime provinces which met the dominion government at Ottawa this morning to protest against scientific basing of freight rates on the Intercolonial Railway, and to urge that they rather be fixed according to the intention of the Act of Confederation.

The building of the Intercolonial Railway was provided for in the terms of Confederation, says Mr. Finn, for the purpose of making the markets of central Canada and western Canada available to maritime industries and to provide an all-Canadian route to the sea. Because of military and political considerations, the British government, who had agreed to guarantee the interest on the loan necessary to build the road on condition that they name the route, chose a line one hundred and thirty-eight miles longer than commercial purposes warranted. Thus, at its outset, declares Mr. Finn, the Intercolonial Railway was never intended to have its rates fixed on a scientific basis, and rates were put into effect which would not act as a barrier to maritime competition in the upper province markets.

Despite original intentions, Mr. Finn continues, the scientific rates basing system by the railway commission under special jurisdiction given it by the government in 1916 under the War Measures Act. This has resulted in freight rates increasing from one hundred to one hundred and fifty per cent. during the past five years. Maritime industry, says Mr. Finn, was able to meet the high freight rates because competition was not a factor and high rates were added to overhead. Competition is once more, however, a factor, and maritime industry cannot enter upon the upper Canadian markets and meet the prices quoted by manufacturers in those provinces. Coincident with the loss of the markets of middle and western Canada through prohibitive freight rates, Mr. Finn points out that export trade practically dried, both to Europe and South America, and there only remains a slender trade with the West Indies. The population of the maritime provinces cannot absorb the products of their industries, and Mr. Finn, together with the remainder of the delegation now at Ottawa, sees maritime industry faced with a crisis of extreme gravity.

The delegation now at Ottawa is probably the strongest which has ever met the dominion government from the

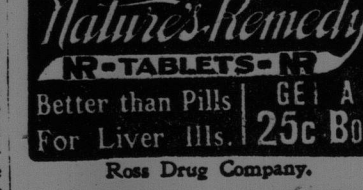

maritime provinces. It includes representatives of the three provincial governments, maritime board of trade, boards of trade of industrial centres of the three provinces, mayors of maritime cities, representatives of commercial clubs, united farmers, fruit growers' associations, live stock associations, lumber interests and representatives of the various manufacturing industries throughout Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. It is considered possible that the government may soon place the Intercolonial system under the Railway Commission, and as this body only has power to fix rates on a scientific basis, it is possible that the government will be asked to give the commission special privilege to make an exception on Intercolonial lines.
