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HON. A. K. MACLEAN  
HAS RESIGNED

One by One the Crew is Leaving the Ship — Maritime Provinces Now Without a Portfolio.

Ottawa, Feb. 23.—Hon. A. K. Maclean has resigned from the union cabinet and another resignation or two may be expected before the coming session has ended. Mr. Maclean told his followers in Halifax in 1917 that he was planning to enter the union government for the duration of the war, and until reconstruction after the war was fairly well advanced. It is said that he intends to contest Halifax at the next general election as a Liberal. His defection leaves the maritime provinces entirely without representation in the cabinet. Mr. Maclean has never accepted a position at the head of a department in the union government.

Toronto, Feb. 24.—The body of eight-year-old Jack Waugh, who was killed by a motor truck in Dufferin street near St. Clair avenue, was brought to the morgue for an inquest. He was badly crushed about the body, the wheels of the truck having passed over him. He was picked up by some of his home, where he died two days later, before medical aid could reach him.

Lads who saw the accident took the number and notified Inspector Umstad, who sent the officers to locate the driver. The latter told the inspector when interrogated that several children had been playing on the sidewalk for a while and he did not know that the child had been injured. He was unable to account for the accident.

According to the police, the youngster had come out of school at noon, and with other lads had caught on the motor truck for a ride. He fell off and slipped beneath a rear wheel of the heavy vehicle.

TO GREECE FROM CANADA. In a letter to the St. John Board of Trade explaining why it had been found necessary to order certain Canadian shipments for Greece through a United States port, the Canadian Trade Commission states that the port to which this material must be shipped depends entirely on the supply of wheat at the various Atlantic ports, as all this traffic is to be loaded on ships supplied by the Greek government for the carriage of Greek troops to the United States port they were conforming to altered arrangements of the wheat board, due largely to the inability of the railroads to get a sufficient volume of wheat to St. John. It is stated that there are now at St. John about 650 cubic tons of manufactured goods awaiting the arrival of a Greek ship. The Canadian Trade Commission assure the board that Canadian ports will, in all cases, receive the preference in the handling of foreign shipments by Canada.

### WELCOMING CHINESE WAR LABORERS HERE

A little bit of international service was well performed here on Sunday when the members of the soldiers' reception committee spent the day in meeting and greeting 1,040 Chinese war coolies who crossed the Atlantic on the steamship Melita. Welcome cards in English and Chinese, and more than 1,000 golden juicy apples, were presented to the war laborers. Their cheerful smiles, and accompanying "thank-yous" and "Mercis" testified to their appreciation of the service that was performed for them.

### FORWARD MOVEMENT

The congregation of Knox church held a successful meeting last night in connection with the forward movement.

The pastor, Rev. R. Moorhead Legate, presided and introduced the speakers, Rev. F. F. McLaughlin, who, with lantern slides, brought the work before the audience. As a result of the meeting last evening subscriptions amounting to \$8,410 were received, while the objective is \$8,400, which is expected to be reached in a few days. The Baptist church movement is being carried on with success. In the city the Baptist churches have a total of \$8,728, while their objective is \$8,000. The Anglican church have a total of \$4,015, while the Carleton Methodist have exceeded their objective of \$2,500, having a total of \$3,500.

### CONCERNING SHIPMENTS TO GREECE FROM CANADA
